Students meeting minimum admission standards except for the need for remedial courses must complete remedial courses at an institution that offers them during the summer in order to be admitted for the fall.



Reduces out-of-state tuition and fees for incoming freshmen* who meet the following requirements:

- Minimum 23 ACT, or 1130 SAT (ERW + M)
- Minimum 2.5 GPA (on a 4.0 unweighted scale)
- No remedial courses required: minimum subscores of 18 ACT/ English, or 25 SAT** (W+L); and 19 ACT/Math, or 510 new SAT**
- Students whose parent(s) graduated from Louisiana Tech are treated as in-state students for tuition purposes.
- Non-resident students who enroll in six or fewer credit hours per quarter are also treated as in-state for tuition purposes.
- * Transfer, dual enrollment, and international students who meet certain criteria may also be eligible for the Bulldog Out-of-State Scholarship.
