Admission Criteria

The Scholars' College seeks highly motivated students who can work independently and who are willing to explore new ideas. The admission criteria are as follows:

- Complete 19 units of the Regents' high school core curriculum or comparable curriculum

We recommend the following GPA and test scores as minimums:

- 3.3 or better unweighted average on a 4.0 scale in high school course work in the Regents' curriculum or comparable curriculum
- ACT composite of 27 or SAT composite of 1260

With

- ACT subscores of at least 25 or SAT subscores of 480

Students who do not meet these recommendations will be considered for admission on an individual basis.

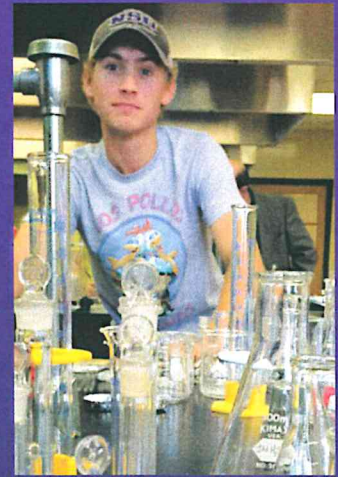
